Howard Blumstein, MD

Topic: Raynaud’s Phenomenon

Dr. Blumstein joined Rheumatology Associates of Long Island in 2005. He graduated summa cum laude from Binghamton University with a Bachelor of Science degree in

biology. He attended SUNY Buffalo School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences. His Internal Medicine residency was completed at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of NJ at Robert Wood Johnson Medical School. He completed his Rheumatology Fellowship at Mount Sinai Medical Center in NY.

Dr. Blumstein is in full-time clinical practice at Rheumatology Association of Long Island (RALI). He is a Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine at Stony Brook University Hospital and participates in the Rheumatology Fellowship Program. Dr. Blumstein has authored scientific papers published in peer-reviewed journals on topics including geriatric rheumatology and temporal arteritis. He has a wide range of clinical interests and cares for patients with rheumatoid arthritis, systemic lupus erythematosus, scleroderma and other collagen vascular diseases. He has been recognized by Vitals.com and has received both Compassionate Doctor Recognition and a Patients’ Choice Award since 2008.

Dr. Blumstein is actively involved in the clinical research program at RALI and is currently a principal investigator on several research projects. He is very involved in political advocacy for patients with rheumatic diseases and regularly represents NY State rheumatology patients for the American College of Rheumatology as well as the NY State Rheumatology Society.



Paul Strachan, MD

Topic: PAH & Scleroderma

Dr. Strachan is a Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine at SUNY Stony Brook and Director of the Stony Brook Pulmonary Hypertension

Center. He received his undergraduate degree cum laude from Adelphi University in Garden City, NY and his medical degree from State University of New York Health Science Center at Brooklyn. He completed his residency in Internal Medicine and fellowship in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Long Island Jewish Medical Center in New Hyde Park, NY. He joined the faculty at Stony Brook in 2006 as a member of the Division of Pulmonary, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine. He participates in the full activities of the division including rounding on the Pulmonary Consult service and in the Medical Intensive Care Unit.

Dr. Strachan has participated in several international multicenter clinical trials for pulmonary hypertension and pulmonary fibrosis. He has been a co-author of several articles found on PubMed. His offices are located in Hauppauge, NY.
